As TA Therapist I am a member of The Netherlands Association for Transactional Analysis. The NVTA is working hard to further connect and professionalise our association. This also includes a clear ethical code and a professional complaints procedure. See link:

The NVTA pursues an active ethics policy. The NVTA has an established code of conduct. This has been adopted from the EATA. Members of the NVTA are expected to commit to this code of conduct. The code of conduct can be downloaded as a PDF file. The NVTA also applies guidelines for professional practice. These guidelines can also be downloaded as a PDF. If desired, the board will take action if a member does not comply with these codes. The Code of Ethics forms an important basis for the complaints procedure. Since the General Meeting of September 2019, the NVTA has an adjusted complaints procedure. The professional members in the form of a trainer, practitioner, therapist, coach or counselor, are deemed to be affiliated with an external party. That can be a self-chosen party. The NVTA offers its members the opportunity to choose a reduced rate, to be connected with the SCAG.

Complaints and Disputes Settlement:

If there is a complaint in relation to a member of the NVTA, it will be handled by this external independent party.
